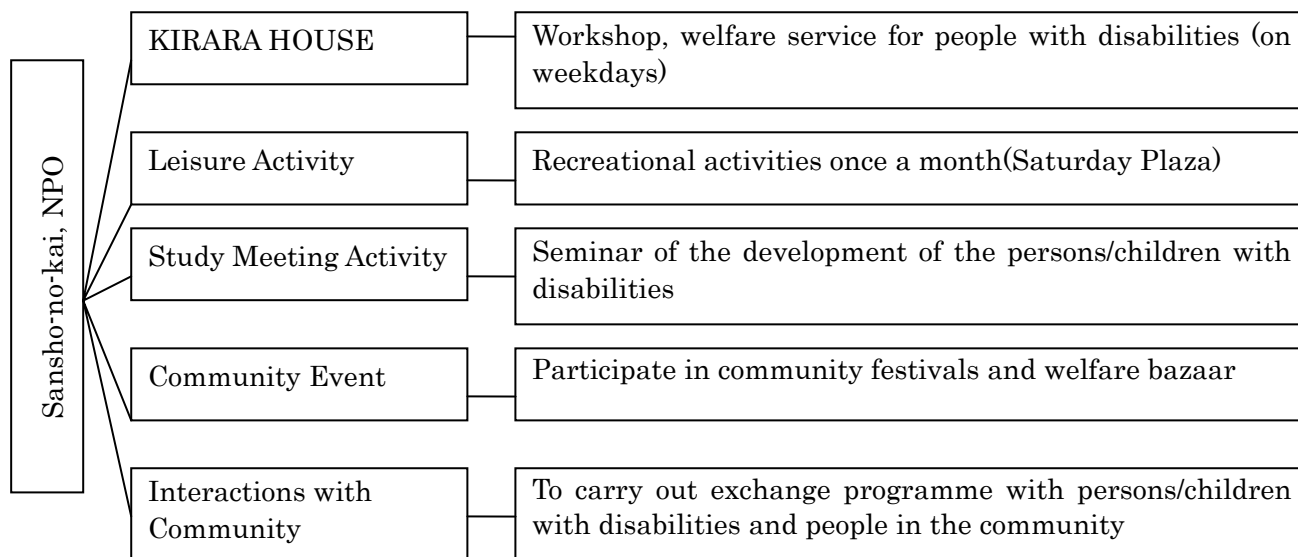

The KIRARA HOUSE is a workshop where persons with disabilities can commute regardless of severity of disability, operates the service business for handicapped person's welfare and assists interaction with people in the community.

<Main activities of Sansho-no-Kai, NPO>



<History of Sansho-no-Kai, NPO>

1989 : started by teaches and parents of special needs school as a study group to improve special needs education.

1996 : changed the name to Sansho-no-kai not only to restrict within educational issues but also to think as issues for all persons with disabilities.

2001 : set up Non-profit Organization Sansho-no-kai.

2002 : authorized as NPO

2003 : opened KIRARA HOUSE

<KIRARA HOUSE under Sansho-no-Kai, NPO>

- Open: 9:00—16:00 Mondays—Fridays
- 9:30~ Meeting : to make sure the flow of the day and each user's work.
- Work: : Baking, woodwork, knitting, field, potting seedlings(February to June), picking(on Thursdays) etc.
- Other activities: : walking training, stroll combined with grocery shopping, exercise, picture book show, music play, etc.
- TOTORO meeting : to talk about the work and events. Sometimes users share their personal problems.
- Support for toileting and eating are also provided when needed.

☆In everyday life, the KIRARA HOUSE

- 1) tries to create a place where a person can realize enjoyment of creating things and working for the purpose of developing on another through works such as wood work, making bread and sweets, handcraft, etc.
- 2) tries to create a place where each user's pace is respected, each person can actively display one's ability, watches trial and error and failure and encourages each other.
- 3) tries to create a group to mutually support, teach and sympathize in union, while placing importance on working and acting together, thinking everyone's problem all together.
- 4) distributes any proceeds to be obtained from the works among users.
- 5) joins the "Kyosaren"(the former National Community Workshop Network) to learn national measures and pioneering activities, etc., for our activities.
